Key Vocabulary:

Henry VIII (1491-1547)

King of England 1509-1547

Married 6 times- Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymour, Anne of Cleves, Ca<mark>therine</mark> Howard, Catherine Parr

"Divorced, Beheaded, Died, Divorced, Beheaded, Died'

Anne Boleyn (about 1507-1536) Queen of England 1533-1536

1501 or 1507 — born Hever Castle

1532 — marriage to King Henry VIII

1533 — daughter Elizabeth I is born

1536-arrested and executed for treason.

Elizabeth 1 (1533-1601)

Queen of England 1558-1603

Never married

Saw Shakespeare's plays

Pharoah — Egyptian term for ruler.

Tudors — a family who ruled Britain




