Legacy : The lasting impact of a person or group of people.

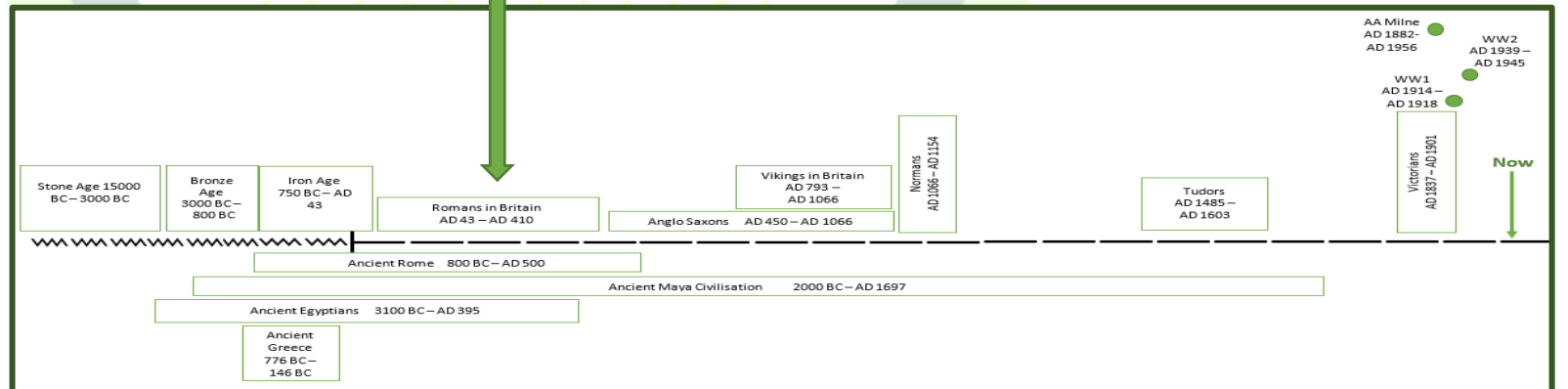
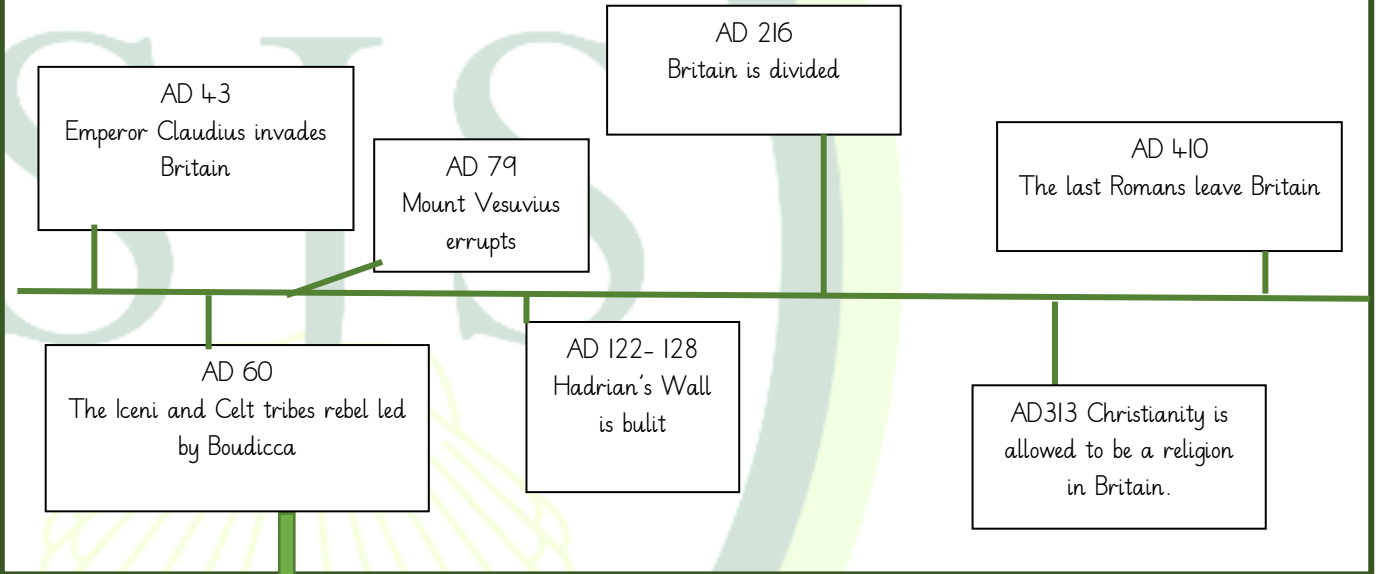
Settlers: People who live and stay in a country for a long period of time.

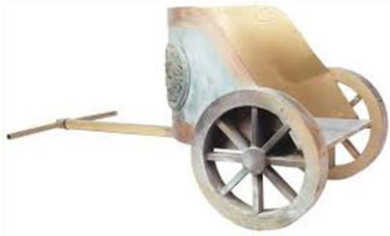

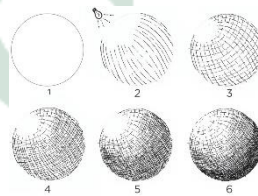

Magma pushes up through a weakness in the Earth's crust

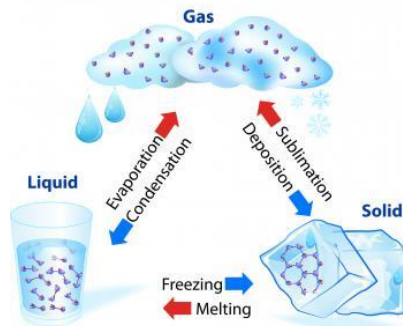
Lava cools and solidifies.

STATE OF MATTER



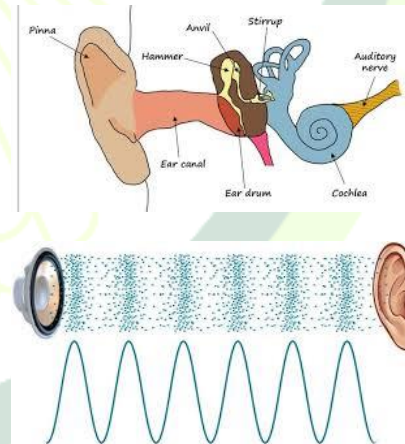
There are 3 states of matter; solid, liquid and gas.

We can change the state of matter by heating or cooling it.

Water can be any of the 3 states, a solid- ice, a liquid – water, a gas – water vapor.

The water cycle is the continuous journey of water from oceans and lakes, to clouds, to rain, to streams, to rivers and back into the ocean again

How do we hear?

Sound is made by vibrations, it travels in waves to our ears.

The higher the wave, the louder the sound.

The closer together the wave the higher the pitch.
