Ame<mark>lia S</mark>cott (1860 -1952) Activist and Campaigner


- One of the first Woman Councillors fo<mark>r Tu</mark>nbridge Wells 1919 -1930

World War I

- Helped refugees from Belgium award from King of Belgium
- Helped clean and repair soldiers' uniforms.

Retirement

- Helped turn a workhouse into a hospital at Pembury.

Campaigner for racism, homelessness and child hunger.

Uses fame as a platform for change.



Stephen Hawking 1942-2018 Oxford

English Scientist — Cosmologist.

Studied the universe and famous for his work on black holes. Had Motor Neurone Disease which affected his muscles.

Key Vocabulary
