Dear parents,

Welcome to the penultimate newsletter of 2020.

The feeling of anger at Tunbridge Wells being in Tier 3 is palpable. I am not sure whether it is the low infection rate and therefore unjustified ranking which is making Tunbridge Wells folk more cross, or whether it is being lumped in with the likes of Swale. People seem quite angry that the rule-breaking Swale, Thanet, Medway crowd are ruining things for the whole county.

Before we get too cross with our "rule-breaking" brothers and sisters a few miles to the north, I would like to point out that we seem to have some St James' children attending birthday parties (!!) and mixing in other households; we know this because they tell us. Almost daily a sizeable crowd of parents and children gather after school in the churchyard for a chat while their children play. None of this is allowed or has been allowed for some time.

Happily, I am enjoying living in Tier 2 Crowborough – slightly tempered by the fact that the Wealden infection rate is higher than here. However, I can understand people's frustrations; the sense of freedom that being in Tier 2 gives is, frankly, exhilarating.

As you know the government are relaxing restrictions over five days at Christmas. I do urge you all to be extremely careful as a widespread relaxation and increased mixing will inevitably lead to increased infection rates and increased incidences of children's bubbles closing and having to access their learning from home. It was a wonderful feeling on Tuesday to welcome Year 1 back to school and I do hope that we can continue to keep the children in school up to and beyond the New Year.

Thank you for continuing to wear face masks on the school grounds. We would be very grateful if parents could also keep these on at other crowded pinch points (narrow pavements, crossings, church yards etc) on the way to and from school.
