### **Shrublands Court parking**

We have had more complaints from residents of Shrublands Court about anti-social parking. Please do not park on double yellow lines or across people's drives, even if you "will only be a few minutes". I will put some sociable parking reminders under the windscreen wipers of offending cars and have also been in contact with the parking enforcement team who have agreed to make random visits and issue tickets for illegal parking. We take maintaining a good relationship with our neighbours very seriously. If parking is becoming difficult, you may find it easier to park further away and/or walk, enjoying the health benefits and opportunities for conversation at the same time.

#### **Test and trace**

If one of your children develops COVID symptoms within 48 hours of the end of term and then tests positive, please email the school office: <a href="mailto:office@st-james.kent.sch.uk">office@st-james.kent.sch.uk</a>. I will monitor emails for the first six days of the summer. If your child develops symptoms after 48 hours (ie after 3:30pm on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> July) you should not contact the school but work with the Test and Trace team.

The current guidance is that from 16<sup>th</sup> August, children (and double vaccinated adults) will not need to isolate if they are a contact of a person testing positive, and isolation instructions will be handled by the Test and Trace team, not schools.

### **Ofsted Parent View**

Ofsted are restarting routine inspections from 1<sup>st</sup> September, and we are expecting a visit early in the school year. As a part of the inspection, Ofsted will want to know your views as parents and they do this by consulting their Parent View website. Parents can grade the school on a number of criteria and leave comments too (which we do not see). I would be very grateful if parents can take a few minutes to log onto the site and leave their honest feedback before the end of the school year. Either or both parents can give their views (via separate logins). The link is below:

#### Ofsted Parent View

This will be the first inspection for the amalgamated school, and the first for either school since 2017 (the juniors). As the junior school closed as a part of the amalgamation process, the outrageously outdated 2008 Infant school





report is still the most recent and therefore gives us our current grade. Back in 2007/8 a number of local schools were judged as outstanding and only us and one other has missed more recent inspection.

#### **Swift Awareness Week**

Its Swift Awareness Week! And thanks to the generosity of our school community, and discounts from Peak Boxes who are making our beautiful nesting boxes, we have ordered and will soon be taking delivery of six quadruple boxes each with room for four pairs of birds to raise their chicks. We will also have a sound system to play the sound of swifts calling (or "shrieking") to let the swifts know that this is a good place to come and set up home. Hopefully we will have a busy swift colony next summer!
