<p>Monday Activity</p> <p>Story In the bible - Luke ch 8n verses 4 to 15</p> <p>Think</p> <p>Prayer</p> <p>Song</p>	<p>Have you planted any seeds recently? How do you look after a plant? What does it need? Do all plants need the same things?</p> <p>If you are at home, take a look in the fridge or the garden. Find some things that grow. If you are in school then take a look outside when you can. Play a game: fruit or vegetable or nuts - where do they grow? Start standing up. If it grows underground then sit on your hands.. If it grows high up then stretch up high. If it is picked from a bush then put your hands on your hips. If it grows on the surface of the ground then touch your toes. Try these: carrot, peas, orange, pepper, melon, tomatoes, strawberries, raspberries, potatoes, hazelnuts, peanuts, walnuts, cucumbers, radishes, broccoli, celery, apples, swede, runner beans, french beans, lemons, kiwis</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DsO2CQS-HRs</p> <p>Explain out loud why you think Jesus told this story. People who follow Jesus don't just listen to what he says but they want to actually do what he asks too.</p> <p>It's a bit like if your Mum talked to you when you are watching television! You might hear what she says with your ears but you don't actually understand it or do what you are asked because you are too busy concentrating on your favourite programme. You might stay there when actually it is time to go and wash your hands ready for tea. Can you think of any other examples when you listen with your ears but don't hear or act on something?</p> <p>Let's ask God to help us to listen properly and then to do what we need to do.</p> <p>Thank you Lord Jesus for the stories that you told and how we can still learn from them. Thank you Father God for all the people who care for me such as _____ Please help me to listen well to them and to follow through with things that I need to do as well. Amen</p>

If you have ever watched a house being built, you would have seen the builders spending a long time going down first to put in strong foundations. They then pour in a lot of concrete! Make a small lego house. If you have some sand then stand it on some sand. The deeper the better. Pour water on top with a watering can until the sand underneath washes away and</p> <p>Then stand the same house on some strong stones. Pour the same amount of water from a watering can on top and notice what happens. Things don't always work perfectly. Your lego house is not cemented to the rock! It will still be worth having a go. What materials make a strong, waterproof house? Think of the story of the 3 little pigs!</p> <p>Learning to read needs a good foundation of phonics. Playing an instrument needs a good understanding of the notes and how to play them as a foundation before you can play songs.</p> <p>Jesus knew that foundations are important and used it to remind people of other things that are important. He wanted people to know that hearing needs action as well. Hear instructions and then do them! Don't hear important instructions and take no notice of them!</p> <p>Lord Jesus, thank you for your stories with meanings. Help us to work hard to have strong learning foundations. Please help us with all our learning. Help us to be people who hear what is said to us and then take action if we need to.
