Dear parents,

It seems as if it has been a very long half term indeed, but the break has finally arrived. I would like to thank the whole team for all of their hard work and dedication since September.

Thank you so much for all of your Harvest donations; it was lovely to see that the St James' community generosity is as strong as ever. We celebrated Harvest this week in both school halls, including the highly addictive "vegetable game" and the tower of pea and ham soup. It was also wonderful to welcome Reception to their first ever Collective Worship in the school hall – they did so well and made all of their teachers very proud indeed.

All of your donations are going to the food bank for the benefit of those in our town in need.

I hope that you have a good half term break, and find plenty of time to rest, as well as time to stock up on petrol, children's Christmas gifts, pigs in blankets and polyester slacks.

COVID cases in school

Once cases within a class reach a certain threshold (usually more than 3 children absent with positive test results) we take further measures to stop further spread within the school which stop that class mixing with others while indoors. Therefore the children will eat lunches and have assemblies in their classrooms. We will continue to send letters home to let parents know when there are positive cases and then again once these cases reach a certain threshold. Please note that it is extremely unlikely that we will be asked to send a class home, even if the majority are absent with COVID.

Parent consultations

We are holding parent consultations in the week commencing 8th November. We plan to hold these in person rather than via Teams, although we will keep you posted and may change this at short notice. Appointments should be made via parentmail and the booking can be made from 4pm today.

Please arrive no more than 5 minutes before your appointment and we ask that you leave as soon as your last appointment is finished to minimise crowding within the school; I have asked teachers to ensure they are very prompt with their timings to avoid any queues outside classrooms, so please do not be offended if some teachers use sand timers or similar to help them keep on time. Consultations will be in classrooms and not in the school halls. Teachers will maintain a safe distance and classrooms will be well ventilated and so please wrap up warm.

Secondary applications and 11+ results

Secondary applications must be made online by the 1st November. Oversubscritpion criteria and other information for all local secondary schools are available on the KCC website.

11+ results were emailed after school yesterday. Please email your child's class teacher if you have any questions and they will do their best to help you or refer you to me for a call. If you have questions about scores and the thresholds required for certain schools, these should be directed to the secondary schools. Please note that no particular score is required for either Weald, TWGGS or TWGSB; if the child has a "G" or grammar assessment then eligibility will be predominantly based on the distance to the school.





If your child took the test but was not "grammar assessed" and you would like to consider a parental appeal for a grammar place, you need to include the grammar school(s) you wish to appeal to as your last choice(s) on the list. There is then nothing to do until March when the school offers are sent out; we are always happy to explain this process to you.
