

LO: To explore Toad's character

LO To complete symmetrical patterns


LO: To complete symmetrical patterns.

You will need the attached maths sheet and it may help to use a mirror.

1 Chilli - Challenge 1 and Challenge 2 grids A and B. Then draw a 6X6 grid in your book and a line of symmetry (a mirror line) to split the grid in half. Make a symmetrical pattern on your grid, using coloured squares.

2 and 3 Chillies – All the questions on the sheet.

Then everyone – have a go at these




A triangle has 1 line of symmetry unless you change the orientation.

Is Jack correct? Prove it.

Jack is incorrect.
Changing the orientation does not change the lines of symmetry.
Children should prove this by drawing shapes in different orientations and identifying the same number of lines of symmetry.
