

# HOME LEARNING

Dear Year 1,

Please look at the Home Learning Grid for today's activities. For English, you will be putting your shopping list in alphabetical order. Have a look at the Easter poem that has been attached. What words can you find that rhyme in the poem? Can you think of a list of words that rhyme with 'Spring'? You will also be revising the sound 'ue' for phonics. Can you think of other ways the 'ue' sound could be spelt? You might like to make your own wordsearch which you can find a template on twinkl or draw one out yourself.

In Maths, start with revising your bonds to 20. Lots of you have said you need a little more practise with these ones. Don't forget about the game 'Hit the Button' on the Topmarks website or alternatively play 'match' with number cards. Next, you will be practising to add within 20 for example  $13 + 6 = 19$ . You can use lots of resources to help you if you need it (100 squares, numberlines, counters, pasta, lego bricks, anything that will help!) See if you can remember how else you can write the addition number sentences. So for the above number sentence, the other way it can be written is  $6 + 13 = 19$ . To extend your learning you could make up your own addition number stories. For example, Tom had 6 mini eggs and his brother gave him 13 more. How many did he have altogether now?

Then you will be choosing an additional challenge from the table. Don't forget about the extra RE challenge and there are some extra challenges at the bottom of the home learning grid too.
