#### RAAC update


A while ago I wrote to you about the school being placed into the Schools Rebuilding Programme (SRP) due to the presence of RAAC across much of the junior building. The RAAC has been mitigated through strengthening works and detailed structural surveys which take place three times per year, however these are not a permanent solution.

We have now been told that we have been placed within Group 2 in the SRP. Group 2 schools will hear from a DfE project manager after April 2025 when site surveys and planning work will begin. This will take up to a year to complete, so no actual work is likely to begin until around April 2026. Building work will take around a year to complete, but could be quicker or longer depending on its extent.

Until the surveys have been completed, we will not know the scope or extent of the work that will be carried out, or how the ongoing education of the children will be managed to keep disruption to an absolute minimum. The work could just involve the junior building, it could include the infant building as well or it could encompass the entire site. We are also unsure whether a new government will have any impact on the suggested timetable, which is already fairly woolly.

Whatever happens, I am determined that the children will be educated on our St James' site throughout the building work and that we remain together as a school – I want no repeat of children being bussed across the town. Obviously, I cannot make any guarantees as some of these decisions will be in the hands of others, but that will be a non-negotiable as far as I have the power to push it.

Once I have more information I will of course share it with you.



## Key Stage 2 results

Year 6 took their externally marked SATs in May, and the results were sent to the school this week. If I am honest, I am immensely proud of our Year 6 children, regardless of any test outcomes; they have been a truly special group of children. Needless to say, our results this year have reflected their attitudes to learning, hard work and the skill of their teachers. The overall outcomes are below for our school and these are compared with results nationally. Our outcomes for children achieving the “higher standard” are also impressive; for example in Reading 47% of the children achieved the higher standard compared with 28% nationally. Congratulations to every child for being themselves and always trying their best.
