Year 6 secondary school applications

Yes, Year 6 may have only just started the year but it is already time to begin applying for secondary school. Applications can be made from now until 31st October on-line at www.kent.gov.uk/ola. If you need further information on secondary admissions please visit www.kent.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions. Please let us know that you have applied and the schools applied for by forwarding us your confirmation email.

Year 6 11+ Kent Tests

If you have registered your child for the Kent Tests they will take place on Thursday 12th September. The tests will run for most of the school day. They begin with the English and Maths Tests, followed by a break and then the Reasoning Tests. After lunch they conclude with the Writing Test. Children should come to school at the normal time and will leave at the normal time at the end of the school day. No special equipment is required, although your child is welcome to bring in their own pencil for the morning tests and their own pen for the afternoon.

Hopefully you will have received a message from the school governors earlier this week. If you would like to volunteer to be a parent governor, please let us know by <u>no later than Friday 13 September</u>. Please include a <u>short</u> statement setting out your reasons for wishing to become a Governor, and the skills and experience you would be able to bring to the role.
