Key Vocabulary: Science

Amphibian – cold blooded animal that lives in water and on land. Lays eggs in water and born with gills before growing lungs. Smooth skin.

Bird – animal with a beak, feathers, two legs and wings. Lays eggs. Some can fly but not all.

Carnivore – animals that only eat meat.

Fish – animal that lives in water. Covered in scales and lays eggs in water. Breathes water through gills.

Herbivore – animals that only eat plants.

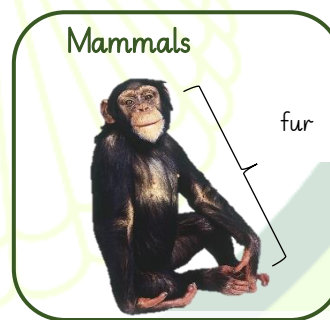
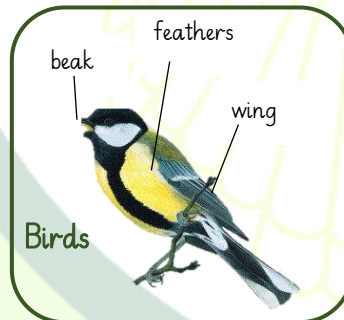
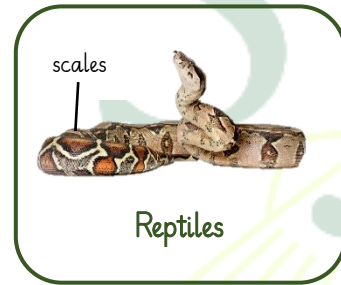
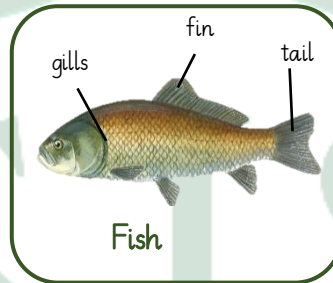
Human – a type of mammal. We are humans.

Mammal – animal with lungs, therefore breathing air. Covered in hair. Has live babies. Not all mammals live on land.

Omnivore – animals that eat both plants and meat.

Reptile – cold blooded animal with dry, scaly skin. Most lay eggs. Live on land.

Senses – how we observe and understand the world around us: sight, hearing, touch, taste and smell.



Key People: Science

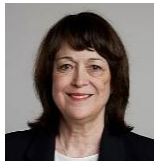
George Mottershead 1894 – 1978

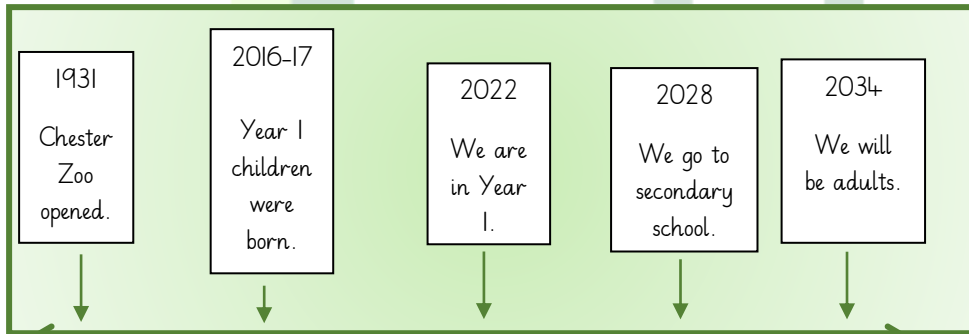
