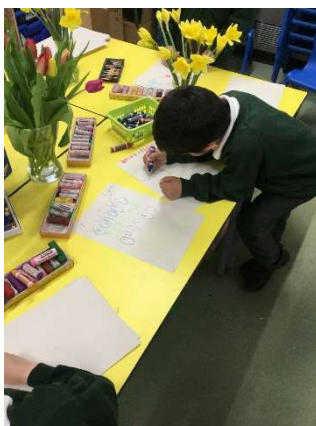


removed and people are now just recommended to stay at home for 5 days. Quite how anyone will test positive when there are no tests means that this is a bit of a moot point.

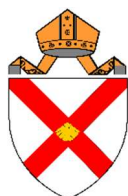


Lower Phase Fantastic Finish

Sports update from Mr Hodges

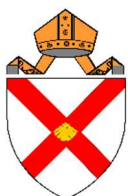
