














This week we will be continuing to focus on the story 'A Home on the River'

Maths Revise addition and Subtraction Problem Solving	Don't say 20. A game for 2 players. On their turn the players choose to continue the count with 1,2 or 3 numbers. The next player continues the count. Eg if the 1 st player counts 1,2, the 2 nd player counts 3, or 3,4 or 3,4,5. The aim is to avoid saying 20. (A number track/ ten frame could be used to make this more visual)	The answer is 14. What could the question be? Can you think of different ways to make 14? Use addition, subtraction and doubling. Can you think of ways using 3 numbers?	 Set up a number track to 20. Cover all the numbers with counters. Start at 20. Take turns to roll a dice. If you roll 1-5, take them away from the track. If you roll 6, put them all back and start again. Aim to remove all the counters.	 Playing cards. Deal 2 cards to each player. Add the cards together. (picture cards count as 10. Ace can be 1 or 11.) At the start of each round decide on the rule. Vary it from the highest wins to the lowest wins. Winner collects a token.	Mr Badger likes to eat worms, berries and mice.
