<p><b>Monday</b></p> <p><b>Choose Activity A or B or try both.</b></p> <p><b>Activity A</b></p> <p><b>Activity B</b></p> <p><b>Matthew 8:23-27</b></p>	<p>There are many events in the life of Jesus that involve water that are not based on a river but on or around the Sea of Galilee. It isn't really a sea but it's such a huge lake that it acts like a sea.</p> <p><b>The storm</b> is our first one and one of the most well known.</p> <p><b>Make a storm.</b> Find a jam jar with a tight screw top lid or a plastic water bottle. Put some water and a few drops of blue food colouring (or a small amount of blue paint) into the jar to make it about one third full.</p> <p>Add some cooking oil so that when it settles there is about one centimetre floating on the top of the water.</p> <p>Next add one teaspoon of glitter if you have some. Make sure that the lid is screwed down tightly.</p> <p>Shake it hard and then watch how long it takes to settle again.</p> <p>The internet has lots of more complicated ways of making storms in jars.</p> <p><b>Active storm</b></p> <p>Ask to borrow an old bedsheet (a double one would be best).</p> <p>If there are at least two people, take one side each and shake it as hard as you can. How quickly can you suddenly make it completely still? If there is just you then tie it securely to something like a fence post. Shake as above. Add a light ball or a few lego bricks. How high can you make them go without them flying off the sheet? How quickly can you make the objects completely still. You could use small soft toys instead. They had courage and boldness to share the ‘good news’ about Jesus with everyone. That day three thousand people decided to trust and follow Jesus too. Those people told more people. That sounds like a fun and exciting river with its source on the Day of Pentecost. I wonder what colour that river would be?</p> <p>You could send someone some good news today. You could paint a picture of the Day of Pentecost or of a river of joy! When have you been nervous or timid? <p><b>Friday</b></p> 	<p><b>Today is celebration day. Check the school website for a video celebration.</b> Happy birthday to anyone with a birthday this week!</p> <p><b>I would like to especially celebrate ‘ENJOYING LEARNING and ‘NOT GIVING UP’ today.</b> ‘Enjoying learning’ and ‘not giving up’ are 2 things that resilient children do. Resilience makes me think of protective armour. It is all about being strong. There are other learning powers that help you to be resilient. Can you think of any more?</p>  <p>What insects or animals can you think of that have a resilient outer layer? I thought of woodlice because they have a hard surface and can curl up.</p>

	<p>You could create some paper or card armour to remind you to be resilient in your learning today.</p> <p>Think of one way that you have enjoyed learning this week.</p> <p>Think of one way that you stuck at something and did not give up.</p> <p>Find a piece of ribbon, string or a pipe cleaner.
