
#### LO: To write a kenning

Remember to jot down ideas first like we did with our class animals.


# LO: To identify expanded noun phrases

Lots of you tried out the PE session with Joe Wicks, and it looked like fun. How about trying a Just dance routine? You may like to give it a go today.


